### Colorado Takes the Lead to Reduce Greenhouse Gas Emissions with the Colorado Carbon Fund

World leaders are meeting at the [UN Conference on Climate Change](#) in Copenhagen (COP15) to discuss action and commitments

to further reduce the impacts of climate change. Also this week the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) released a statement confirming that greenhouse gases (GHGs) are a threat to public health and the environment. The EPA found that GHG emissions are the primary driver of climate change, which can lead to hotter, longer heat waves that threaten the health of the sick, poor or elderly; increase ground-level ozone pollution linked to asthma and other respiratory illnesses; as well as exacerbate other threats to the health and welfare of Americans.

Colorado has taken the lead to reduce GHG emissions with a state Climate Action Plan, and a variety of initiatives to promote energy efficiency and renewable energy to improve the state's economy. As part of the state's commitment to the New Energy Economy, the Governor's Energy Office (GEO) last year launched the first state-run voluntary carbon offset program in the country, the Colorado Carbon Fund



Through the GEO's Project C educational campaign, individuals and businesses are provided tools and resources to calculate and reduce their own carbon footprint, and offset unavoidable carbon emissions by donating to the Colorado Carbon Fund. Contributions to the Colorado Carbon Fund support new energy efficiency and renewable energy projects in Colorado that reduce greenhouse gas emissions and stimulate the state's economy.
